<p>Voter ID - Ohio accepts many types of voter ID</p> <p>An <u>Ohio driver's license or state ID card</u> with your name and photo. The card must not be expired, but it can have an old address if your registration is current.</p> <p>A <u>U.S. Military ID</u> with your name and photo (address not required).</p> <p>An unexpired <u>government ID</u> with your name, current address, and photo. Student ID is not accepted.</p> <p>An original or copy of one of the following <u>documents</u> with your name and current address: utility bill (including cell phone bill), bank or financial advisor statement, pay stub, government check, or other government document. The document must have a date within one year of Election Day.</p> <p>If you do not have any of the above, you may use the <u>last 4 digits of your Social Security number, but you will have to vote a provisional ballot</u>. It will be counted so long as the number matches your voter registration.
