National LWVEF running voter registration web ads in Ohio

Reinforcing the impact Leagues will have by sharing their Voters' Guide on VOTE411, the national League of Women Voters Education Fund (LWVEF) will be running targeted online ads in Ohio that will drive potential voters to www.VOTE411.org and its voter registration tool in advance of Ohio's Oct. 9th registration deadline.

The ads will appear on websites frequented by citizens from underrepresented communities who may have moved since the last election, and the ads will also display on both mobile and desktop devices. The voter registration ads will run from Sept. 20 through Oct. 9 - and will soon be available to view on US's website, www.lwv.org.

Election Protection: 1-866-OUR-VOTE

Are you looking for a way to help out on Election Day? Then volunteer with Election Protection!

Election Protection is a nonpartisan program that seeks to help voters on Election Day by answering questions and trouble-shooting problems. In addition to the well-known hotline, 1-866-OUR-VOTE, Election Protection also has volunteers working on the ground across Ohio.

Election Protection is looking for two types of volunteers:

- <u>Legal volunteers</u> Election Protection is currently recruiting attorneys, paralegals, law students, and other people familiar with election law to participate in legal field deployments on Election Day to ensure the process is running properly. Volunteers do not need to commit to working the entire day and may sign up for specific shifts that fit their schedule. Training will be provided.

Pass-through funds available for Leagues engaging nontraditional student voters

The League of Women Voters of Ohio Education Fund (LWVOEF) has secured funding to assist Leagues around the state in doing targeted voter registration, education, and get-out-the-vote activities on the campuses of Ohio's many community colleges, technical colleges, and extension campuses. These campuses are great places to reach many of our most under-represented voting demographics - young, old, low-income, displaced workers, minority, and women voters.

There are currently ten (10) grants of \$200 each available. The state League is pursuing additional funding in the hopes of being able to provide more pass-through grants. Leagues may submit a joint application for outreach to a shared campus and split the money. Grants will be issued on a first come, first served basis.

How does a League apply for the grant? The League president should complete and submit the application form at [click here for the grant application]. If two or more Leagues submit a joint application, then both Leagues' information should be included on the form.

Reminder about Voting 1-2-3 Stipend

The state League is able to offer each local League a \$50 stipend in exchange for including the Voting 1-2-3 materials in your League's existing voter-service plans. Click here to download the application form.
